

# INTERNATIONAL DEPARTURE TAX CHECKLIST



№	<b>TIPS FOR TRAVELERS</b>	
1	Check your flight itinerary or e-ticket for any mention of 'departure tax', 'exit fee', or 'airport tax'.	
2	Visit your airline's website or contact them to confirm whether the departure tax is included in your ticket price.	
3	Look up the destination country's departure tax requirements online before your trip (government or embassy websites are best).	
4	Bring sufficient local currency or U.S. dollars if the airport requires cash-only payment.	
5	Keep small denominations handy for quicker transactions at airport kiosks or booths.	
6	If traveling through smaller or regional airports, double-check if they have different rules from international hubs.	
7	Ask at the airline check-in counter whether you need to pay a separate tax before departure.	
8	Watch for signage at the airport that directs you to the tax payment counter or kiosk.	
9	Retain any receipt or sticker given after payment - you may need to show it at security or the boarding gate.	
10	Plan extra time at the airport (15-30 minutes) to accommodate payment queues, especially in high season.	
11	Always have a backup payment method and some emergency cash. Not all terminals accept cards or have reliable systems.
